
Sustainable deforestation-free palm oil for food in Europe in 2018

Challenges

Downstream - Europe

- Increase uptake of sustainable palm oil
- Explain the impact of sustainable palm oil
- Rebalance the palm oil image / debate focusing on both sustainable and nutrional aspects

Upstream - palm oil producing countries

- Good Governance
- End deforestation / expansion of palm oil on peat soils
- Implementation of mandatory national standards ISPO
- Support (independent) smallholders
 - GAP, finance, markets, replanting, Verified Sourcing Areas

Solution

True and honest storytelling

- Including challenges and opportunities
- Give confidence to the users of CSPO that they are doing the right thing

Constructive dialogue and cooperation

- Between downstream and upstream partners
- Governments, Industry and NGOs

EPOA's Position on Regulatory Measures

- EPOA supports the development of regulatory measures in order to create a sustainable deforestation-free palm oil trade and consumption in the EU;
- Regulatory measures should be introduced in a positive manner to promote sustainable production and trade and not being used as an instrument of protectionism or a non-trade barrier and should prevent to increase administrative burdens;
- Principles and criteria within regulatory measures should build upon existing private sustainability
 initiatives and (inter) national (voluntary) standards that have driven supply chain transformation over
 the last decade and which includes environmental, social and economic aspects;
- EPOA believes that a mandatory due diligence for European companies using palm oil should be one
 of the regulatory measures;
- EPOA acknowledges that sustainable deforestation-free production can only be achieved when good governance in the (palm oil) producing countries is in place, and (smallholder) producers are supported to make the changes needed.


